Homelessness	Homeless families do not report to the school site. We will make sure teachers know how to access Project Upstart. Teachers and counselors will continue to communicate regularly with parents who are identified with needs and will maintain a report with them.
Child Care	Parents are expressing the needs of child care before and after school due to changes in work schedules and inability to be able to get their children to school on time or picked up from school on time. Through after care enrichment programs and before care tutoring being provided at the school site, parents have the option to enroll in these free programs to assist with child care needs.
